

Oak Hollow Buddy Rally Wed, Oct 26 to Sun, Oct 29

Appalachian Airstream Unit #115

- 1.) The rally is a buddy rally, so <u>PLEASE</u> invite your non-Airstream camping friends to come with us. Call Rich Work; cell 304-922-2298 with your intent to come to our rally. When you attend, pay Rich \$45, of which \$10 is a rally fee to cover breakfast on Thurs, Friday, and Saturday; and \$35 covers the 1 night deposit which was required to reserve our rally. Pay the other 3 nights fee to Oak Hollow Campground, \$105. All suggested events below are at your own expense.
- 2.) We will all gather up at the Virginia Welcome Center around 9:00 AM (the first rest area as you travel from Princeton, WV south on I-77. It's roughly 6 miles after you enter Virginia from West Virginia. See map attached). From there we will head on south to the Oak Hollow Campground in High Point, North Carolina, about 2 hrs & 16 minutes south of Princeton. See the attached 2 page map attached. Page 1 shows the overall route from Princeton to High Point. Page 2 shows details near Oak Hollow and 2 alternate paths of entry. Path 1 (Yellow) winds through a neighborhood and the streets are a bit narrow. Path 2 (Blue) is a bit longer, but it is fairly direct and a bit easier to navigate. We depart on Sunday morning, October 29th.
- 3.) Day 1, Wednesday, October 26. We should arrive around 12:00 noon and set up camp. Lunch is on your own. We might consider going to the Liberty Brewery & Grill for dinner. Great Steaks & dinners, and it is a microbrew.
- 4.) Day 2, Thursday, October 27. We suggest a trip to the North Carolina Zoo, the <u>largest zoo in the world</u>. We suggest that we arrive at the zoo around 8:45 AM (15 minutes before they open). Hopefully, that will get us in line ahead of many others, and grant some of you who have trouble walking, a chance to rent a motorized wheelchair for the day. (They are limited in supply, they must be rented from inside the zoo, and there are no refunds for your admission if you decide not to stay.) They also have regular wheel chairs to rent. If you are walking the zoo, we suggest that you enter from either of 2 parking lots, take the tram to the "Junction Plaza" (mid station) and walk to the end where your car <u>isn't</u> parked. Then take the tram to the mid station, and walk to the end where your car <u>is</u> parked. It is down hill both ways from the mid station.
- 5.) Day 3, Friday, October 28. We suggest a visit to the North Carolina Transportation Museum. Here, you railroaders can have a chance to see a number of old locomotives (some steam) and even buy a 25 minute ride on an old train. There is a roundhouse that was used by N&W on site. There are also many old planes & Automobiles.
- 6.) Day 4, Saturday, October 29. We suggest a visit to the Richard Petty Museum. Race fans will have a good time here.
- 7.) Meanwhile, we will fit in a trip to the "Out-of-Doors Mart" which claims to be the longest running Air-stream dealership in the world. They do sales and service. Bring a list of the parts that you need.

CAMPSITES

- · Sites are first come, first served.
- · Register before picking a site.
- · Minimum age to rent a site is 18 years old.
- 6 person maximum per site (Campers & Visitors).
- · Check-out time is 4:00 pm.
- · 21-Day stay limit.
- · Extended stay can be requested.
- Reservations are available for clubs & the Semi-Annual Furniture Markets.
- · Quiet Hours are 10:00 pm-7:00 am.
- · Two vehicles are permitted at each site.
- · Keep campsites clean.
- · All trash must be put in dumpsters.
- · Washing vehicles & RVs is not permitted.
- Entrance gate closed 8:30 pm-6:00 am.

PETS

- Pets must be under control of their owners & kept on a leash at all times.
- · Proof of current vaccinations is required.
- · Pets are not allowed in bathhouses or pool.
- · Pick up waste and dispose in dumpsters.
- Management reserves the right to deny aggressive breed animals.

BANK FISHING/BOATING

- · Bank fishing is allowed at the campground.
- · Fishing license required for anyone 16 or older.
- · Guests may fish with paid permit from the office.
- Campers may bring and use a boat while camping (Launch Fee Required).
- Campers may beach their boat at the campground overnight.
- · Boats must be off the water at the lake by closing time.

VISITORS

- · All Visitors must register at campground office.
- · Visitors are not permitted during quiet hours.
- · Visitor tag must be displayed in vehicle.
- · Visitors are not allowed to use the pool.
- · Visitors are allowed to bank fish with a paid permit.
- · Visitors allowed if under the 6 person maximum at
- a campsite and no more than two cars at a campsite.

CAMPGROUND POOL

- · Arm band required to use the pool.
- · Only registered campers are permitted to use pool.
- · Pool closes at 7:30 pm.
- · No lifeguard on duty.
- · Children must be supervised by an adult.
- · Glass is not permitted.
- Smoking is not permitted.

SAFETY

- · Observe posted speed limits.
- · Firearms are not permitted in the campground.
- · Campfires are not permitted.
- · Roadside parking is not allowed.
- · Alcohol & illegal drugs are not permitted.
- The campground is not responsible for lost items, accidents or injuries.



Africa Tram Road Under Construction

The Africa tram road between Junction Plaza and Akiba Market is under construction. While the construction is underway, the tram route between Junction Plaza and Akiba Market along with the Dino Bus may be closed. Africa animal habitats will be open and are best seen by walking. The North America tram route and the parking lot shuttles between Africa and North America will operate as normal. Please call ahead at 800.488.0444 to check on Africa tram route and Dino bus availability.

1. In-Park Tram and Bus Service

This service runs *inside* the Park. Please note that animals are not visible from the trams or buses. Visitors can ride on open-air trams or air-conditioned buses. The buses can be identified by their zebra stripes.

There are three tram stops inside the Park: North America, Africa Akiba Market and Junction Plaza . The Junction Plaza tram stops allow visitors to travel in either direction. See <u>Park Map</u>.

The wait time for a tram or bus averages 30 minutes. During heavy visitation periods, the wait may be longer.

In-Park transportation service operates from 9 a.m. until 30 minutes after closing.

Trams and buses accommodate strollers that are empty and folded and wheelchairs.

2. Parking lot shuttle service

This service runs outside the Park between the North America and Africa parking lots.

The shuttle stops are located a short distance outside the ticket booths at both the North America and Africa entrances. Use this service if you finish your visit at the opposite entrance from where you parked your car. It is faster to use the parking lot shuttle than the in-Park tram or bus.

Parking lot shuttle service operates from 11 a.m. until 30 minutes after closing.

Parking is free

When you arrive at the North Carolina Zoo, you will see that it has two regions, North America and Africa. Each region has its own parking lots and ticket booths. After you park your vehicle, please take note of the parking lot number or letter for easy return at the end of your visit. Shuttles are available between parking lots. The road between the North America and Africa parking lots is about one mile. You can visit the entire Park from either entrance using one ticket. See Park Map.

Both entrances are on a level walking surface and have accessible drop-off points for visitors who are mobility impaired. Accessible parking spaces are available with a valid license plate or hangtag. Rental <u>wheelchairs and strollers</u> are available at both Park entrances.

Stroller and Wheelchair Fees

Single Stroller Rental.....\$9 + tax
Double Stroller Rental.....\$11 + tax
Manual Wheelchairs....\$10 + tax
Electric Wheelchairs....\$28 + tax

Entry refunds are not provided if wheelchairs are not available for rent. All rentals are on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be reserved.

Transporting Strollers and Wheelchairs

There are three tram stops in the Park, one at each entrance and one at the center at the Park at Junction Plaza. Trams and buses move guests to strategic locations in the Park, not to each habitat. Not all vehicles are accessible. A vehicle with a lift will be dispatched to the designated tram stop.
